Dear Parents

This week more of our children have had the opportunity to learn about Road Safety, either with a Road Safety Walk or Road Safety Sequencing activities, delivered by the Road Safety team at Medway. It is especially important for our children to know how to keep themselves safe in winter as the weather is darker and therefore the children are less visible, also there are more electric cars on the road that are not as easy to hear as petrol based vehicles. Please take the opportunity to talk to your child about what they have learned and to practice theses skills when you are out and about as a family.

#### **Christmas Production and Tickets**

#### **Production times**

Please read the following carefully as booking tickets for the productions will be slightly different this year.

The dates and times of the productions are as follows:

13<sup>th</sup> December - 09:30, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 production (key stage 1)

13<sup>th</sup> December – 13:45, Year 3, Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6 production (key stage 2)

14<sup>th</sup> December – 16:00 all year groups production

In the evening performance on the 14<sup>th</sup> December there will be a brief interval between the key stage 1 and the key stage 2 production. This is to allow any families who do not have children in key stage 2 to leave and take their children home rather than our younger children having to stay right until the end. If you only have children in key stage 2 and wish to come to the evening performance you are invited to attend at the start of the interval to be ready for the key stage 2 production (time to be confirmed nearer the date but will probably be around 16:30/16:45). If you have children in both key stages you are able to attend at 16:00 and stay for the duration.

#### Tickets

All families will be able to book a ticket for the Christmas production via MCAS

If you would like to attend a <u>daytime performance</u> - If you have children in key stage 1 only you will be able to book 1 ticket for the 09:30 performance on the 13<sup>th</sup> December. If you have children in key stage 2 only you will be able to book 1 ticket for the 13:45 performance on the 13<sup>th</sup> December. If you have children in key stage 2 noly you will be able to book 1 ticket for the 13:45 performance on the 09:30 performance and 1 ticket for the 13:45 performance.

If you would like to attend the <u>evening performance</u> – you will be able to book 1 ticket for the evening performance. As explained above:

- if you only have ks1 children you will be able to leave at the interval
- If you only have ks2 children you will be able to arrive at the interval
- If you have children in both key stages you stay for the whole performance.

**Each ticket is for 1 person, not 1 family -** whilst we understand that wider family members would like to attend we do not have unlimited capacity and therefore to ensure all families have the opportunity to see their children perform we are operating the 1 ticket per performance system.

All tickets must be bought on MCAS, each ticket will cost  $\pounds 1$  and you will receive a programme and a sweet on arrival

If there are any spaces left after booking for the performances on MCAS closes there **may** be the option to request additional tickets however we cannot guarantee this. Paper tickets will not be issued as MCAS generates a list of the booked names, we will only be able to allow those individuals that have booked into the performance. Please do not attend with additional guests as they will not be admitted into the hall.

MCAS booking will open on Friday 24th November and will close on Monday 11th December.

 Parish News


We are looking forward to seeing you at the Parish Christmas fayre on Saturday between 11am and 3pm.

This Sunday is the feast of Christ the King. Children's Liturgy will be on during 11 o'clock Mass. All children who have not yet started the First Reconciliation programme are welcome. (Pre-schoolers should be accompanied by a responsible adult.)

Christmas Eve is fast approaching! If your child(ren) would like to take part in the Nativity play at 6pm Mass on Christmas Eve (24th December) please let Mrs Wilson or Mrs Law (at church) know. Any primary school aged child is welcome to join us, even if they have made their first Holy Communion. Older children will have the option to narrate or lead the bidding prayers or they can dress up and support the younger children if they prefer. If your child would like a specific role (Mary, Joseph, shepherd, angel, sheep, donkey etc) please let us know that too and we will do our best to accommodate their request. (Obviously we can only have one Mary and one Joseph!) Please note, we do not have Kings until the Epiphany. Prac-tices will start next week (Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> December) and will be between 9am and 11am Masses (to suit as many people as possible). They will start at approximately 10.15 and finish at around 10.45. Times can only be approximate due to Mass. Don't worry if your child can't attend every practice but please come to at least one. It is helpful (but not absolutely essential) if readers come to all three practices (3rd, 10<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>). We ask you to provide and bring your child in costume where possible, but will source costumes if needed (as long as we know in advance).

## Do you have a child starting primary school in September 2024?


You must apply to your home LA i.e if you pay your council tax to Medway you would apply to Medway if you pay it to Maidstone you would apply to Kent.

## Parental Advice on Contacting Social Media Sites

It is easy for adults and young children to share things online that sometimes they may wish that they hadn't. If a child has posted something that they regret, you should advise them to delete it from their account as quickly as they can. Most websites and social media platforms provide an option for users to report to them to request removal of 'content' such as videos, pictures, comments or profiles that might be upsetting. However, it is important to know that making a report doesn't mean that the content will definitely be removed. Most websites and social media sites have a set of rules (Terms of Use) which they expect people using their site to obey.

If your child has been a victim of online bullying and has had a nasty message, picture or video posted about them, you can ask the school for support to help find out who might have posted the content. In addition to your child speaking to you, they may wish to talk to someone outside of the family about what has happened to them and how it made them feel. Let them know that they can always call Childline with any worry, big or small on 0800 11 11. Within school, all children have posters available to them with the telephone number and also who to speak to if they're worried. Children also have a safeguarding notice board and have had a safeguarding assembly at the start of this academic year to support them.

If you are worried about a child, please contact Medway Safeguarding Children's Partnership to report your concerns or contact the school's safeguarding team for further support in doing so. You can also report through the NSPCC.
