A Note for Year 6 Families - Catholic Secondary School Applications

As many of our Year 6 families begin exploring secondary school options, we'd like to remind you of an important aspect of applying to Catholic schools. If you wish for your child to continue their education within the Catholic faith, you may be asked to provide a supporting letter from your parish priest.

This letter typically confirms that your family regularly attends weekend Masses in church, not just school-led liturgies. Please bear this in mind when considering your application, as a parish priest may not be able to support your request if regular attendance cannot be confirmed.

We share this to help avoid any disappointment and to ensure families are well-informed during this important time.

Conduct on School Grounds and Upholding Our Gospel Values

At St Thomas More, our gospel values—respect, compassion, forgiveness, and integrity—are at the heart of everything we do. These values guide how we treat one another and how we respond to challenges within our school community.

Whilst on occasions, as with all schools, pupils may make the wrong choice throughout their schooling and we strive to ensure that every incident is addressed fairly, consistently, and with a focus on learning and restoration. Our aim is always to help children grow in character and responsibility.

However, I must remind all parents and carers that verbal or threatening behaviour towards any child is not acceptable. We cannot condone actions that undermine the safe and respectful environment we work so hard to maintain.

If you have concerns, I respectfully ask that you follow the correct channels by speaking with your child's class teacher in the first instance. This allows us to work together constructively and in the best interests of all children involved.
